The program is fun for everyone, teaching the fundamentals of acting, auditioning and performance through group work and rehearsal. Theater experiences build self-confidence on stage and a creative outlet, offering a reward unlike any other. No prior experience is needed!

Beauty and the Beast tells the story of a prince who is transformed into a hideous beast as punishment for his cruel and selfish ways, and an adventurous young woman named Belle whom he imprisons in his castle. In order to become human again, the Beast must earn Belle's love before it's too late.

Grades:	All 3 rd , 4 th , 5 th , 6 th , 7 th and 8 th graders are invited to audition, including homeschool children who are members of St. Antoninus parish.
Cost:	\$100 due the day of auditions made payable to “ St. Antoninus ”. This includes a copy of the script, rehearsal music, and t-shirt.
Sign-Ups:	Deadline is Wednesday, November 9th. A sign up genius will be sent out through the school weekly notes. If your child wants to try out for a role in the play, please sign them up for one of the audition times. Audition songs and scenes will be emailed out to those who are interested in a role. If they would like to be considered for a singing part, please be prepared to sing a song from <i>Beauty and the Beast</i> . Children will be asked to read from a sample script which will be distributed in the audition packet. Auditions will be set up in 15 minute increments and will have 5 children in the room at a time.

Show Dates:	Play performances are Thursday March 2 (7:00), Friday March 3 (7:00) and Saturday March 4 (1:00 and 7:00) All cast members must be available for ALL performances.
