Welcome to the St. Antoninus Network of Care (NOC)

Our ministry is to provide services to parishioners in need of assistance. We are called to be witnesses to Jesus by following his example of love and service. The services we offer parishioners are meant to welcome and evangelize, and meant to ease their burden while they go through a difficult time as a sign of our love and support..... kind of like a “hug” from our parish. Our ministry started in 2017 and our mission today is to share our ministry with you.

What does the NOC provide?

MEALS: We coordinate meals to parishioners who have had surgery, a hospital stay, or extended illnesses. We offer meals to families welcoming new children and to families who have lost loved ones.

TRANSPORTATION: We coordinate transportation for those who need a ride to weekend Mass.

GREETERS: We greet at weekend Masses, welcoming parishioners and visitors at the church entrances. Friendly faces set the tone for our liturgies.

LISTENING EAR: Volunteers with personal experiences are available through a Listening Ear for anyone who would like to speak to someone in a confidential, caring and nonjudgmental manner about difficulties they are facing (problems related to pregnancy, death, marriage, job loss/search, loneliness, incarceration, cancer, abortion, addiction and mental health).

SPECIAL EVENTS: We offer help with special receptions and welcoming committees!

We need YOU...women, men, young people!

We need volunteers to sign up to provide a meal on an as needed basis, provide transportation once a month or every other month to a parishioner as needed, greet at a weekend Mass (love families/students needing service hours to help!), and help with special events.
