

Dear Incoming 7th Grade Students and Parents,

The Language Arts Department has a summer reading requirement for incoming 6th, 7th, and 8th graders. We want the students to continue to develop their reading skills in the following areas: comprehension, characterization, plot development, theme, cause and effect, and author's purpose.

To that end, students are asked to read **at least two novels this summer**. Students must be prepared to utilize these novels in a writing assignment and take an Accelerated Reader quiz on the novels by the first week of school.
